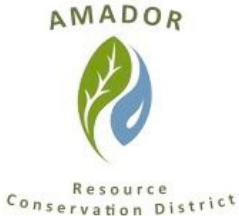

## Appendix 5: Shared Staff – ARCD/AFSC Natural Resource Technical Assistance

**Office Space:** ARCD will be providing office space which will include a desk and access to phone, computer, internet, and printer. If AFSC wants to provide email address/ AFSC phone for staff this will be paid for by the AFSC.

**Equipment/software cost:** General office equipment will be provided by ARCD. If materials/software specific to AFSC are needed this will be invoiced to AFSC following approval.

**Staffing:** ARCD will provide staffing in the form of contractors. Staff will report directly to ARCD.

**Invoicing:** ARCD will be responsible for invoicing to the AFSC for reimbursement. The ARCD will prepare monthly invoices including hours worked and a summary of activities completed, all hours will be assigned to an active grant/project. The invoice will be submitted to AFSC on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of each month.

### Scope of Work:

Essential Functions:

- Collaborate with partners and stakeholders to develop, fund, and implement forest health and fuel reduction, and other projects as needed such as: defensible space, strategic fuel breaks, prescribed burning, forest stand improvement, and invasive species removal and revegetation.
- Under the supervision of the Executive Director manage contractors implementing forestry projects including large landscape scale forest health, strategic fuel breaks, and fire fuel mitigation projects
- Under the supervision of the Executive Director manage contracts with funders, consultants, and subcontractors.
- Work with supporting staff to manage project budgets, invoicing, and reporting.
- Coordinate with project partners and consultants to develop environmental documentation and permits.
- Coordinate the development of project designs and logistics for project implementation.
- Provide oversight of implementation activities, including photo and biological monitoring.
- Grant writing and reporting.
- Assist staff on other projects as appropriate.
- Respond to landowner requests for technical assistance in relation to current or future AFSC projects.
- Oversee monitoring activities, including collecting data in the field, data entry, equipment preparation and maintaining supplies.

Prepared for: October 20<sup>th</sup> 2022 Board Meeting

**General Updates:** Tamryn Zahradka started with the ARCD on October 3<sup>rd</sup>. She is working to get NRCS link pass and up to date with ARCD/AFSC/NRCS projects. AFSC will vote on the Partnership Agreement appendix covering Tamryn's staff time spent on AFSC projects.

**ARCD Credit Card:** The ARCD staff recommends that the ARCD apply to the CalCard credit card program. This program is specifically designed for special districts and allows for individual controls on each card.

**Current Projects Updates:**

**Three Meadows, NFWF Grant:** Need to address Force Majeure Claim. LGM has requested payment of \$65,461.46.

**Community Chipping Program:** CaFSC chipping project will be completed on October 31<sup>st</sup> 2022. Work will immediately start on the CalFire grant, leading to a seamless transition.

**Healthy Soil Program Technical Assistance Funding-** Holistic Grazing Planning Workshop will be held on November 11 + 12.

**NACD 2021 & 2022:** Tamryn is working with NRCS staff to become a certified conservation planning.

**Grazing for Fuels Prevention and Forest Health:** ARCD is still working to collect all ROEs and conduct initial site visits. ARCD will be calling and conducting site visits to get crucial ROEs. ARCD staff and forester are working on final review on PSA.

**Upcoming Funding/Projects:**

**Carbon Hub (Natural & Working Lands Hub) Funding:** grant application submitted. Likely will hear December 2022.

Megan is attending a grant writing workshop and will be working on a program to aid low-income, seniors, disabled, and veterans to develop defensible space. Likely this funding will be the CalFire Fire Prevention funding which will be released in winter 2022.

**CARCD Regional Meeting:**

Harold Singer, the current Central Sierra regional Chair, is looking for a replacement. He is willing to have a conversation with any willing board member that might be interested in serving as regional chair. Amador County will also be hosting the fall regional meeting, date is TBD.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

This project involves the clearance of roadside vegetation (fuels) on private roads within unincorporated regions in Amador County, California. There are a total of four roads to be treated under this project with a total of 2.42 miles covering 11.7 acres total area. All roadside vegetation up to 10 inches diameter at breast height (dbh) shall be removed within 20 feet of road edge on either side. This distance may be reduced in locations where fences exist within this 20-foot zone. The vegetation to be treated includes ground fuels, brush, and small-diameter trees. Private contractors will be used to hand cut and chip vegetation or masticate vegetation on-site by means of a mechanical masticator. This mastication will be “reach-in” mastication only, with the mastication equipment sitting on the actual road prism. In addition, all trees greater than 10 inches dbh within the proposed project area shall be limbed up to a minimum height of 10 feet. All equipment and vehicles shall remain on the existing road prism.

This roadside vegetation clearance project will include the maintenance of some or all of the treated areas by a variety of methods, including re-cutting and chipping, additional mechanical mastication (as described above), or by the use of additional methods such as the selective use of herbicides or other treatment methods.

The intent is for this Notice of Exemption to cover ongoing roadside clearance in perpetuity.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

This project will create a 200-acre community fuel break around the town of River Pines, a registered Firewise Community.

The objective of the project is to create a shaded fuel break by reducing surface and ladder fuels and increasing canopy spacing to mitigate the threat of wildfire to private property. The project will utilize a combination of treatments which may include mastication, hand thinning, and chipping. Ground fuels and brush will be masticated, and small conifer and hardwood trees will be thinned on both improved and unimproved parcels surrounding River Pines. Property owners included in the project have signed Right-of-Entry agreements to allow project work to be performed on their properties. The project area has been flagged on the ground with Pink-Glo plastic flagging. Work will be done outside the required defensible space of 100 feet around homes.

This community fuel break project will include the maintenance of some or all the treated areas by a variety of methods, including re-cutting vegetation and chipping, additional mechanical mastication, or using additional methods such as the selective use of herbicides or other treatment methods.

The intent is for this Notice of Exemption to cover ongoing maintenance of the project in perpetuity.

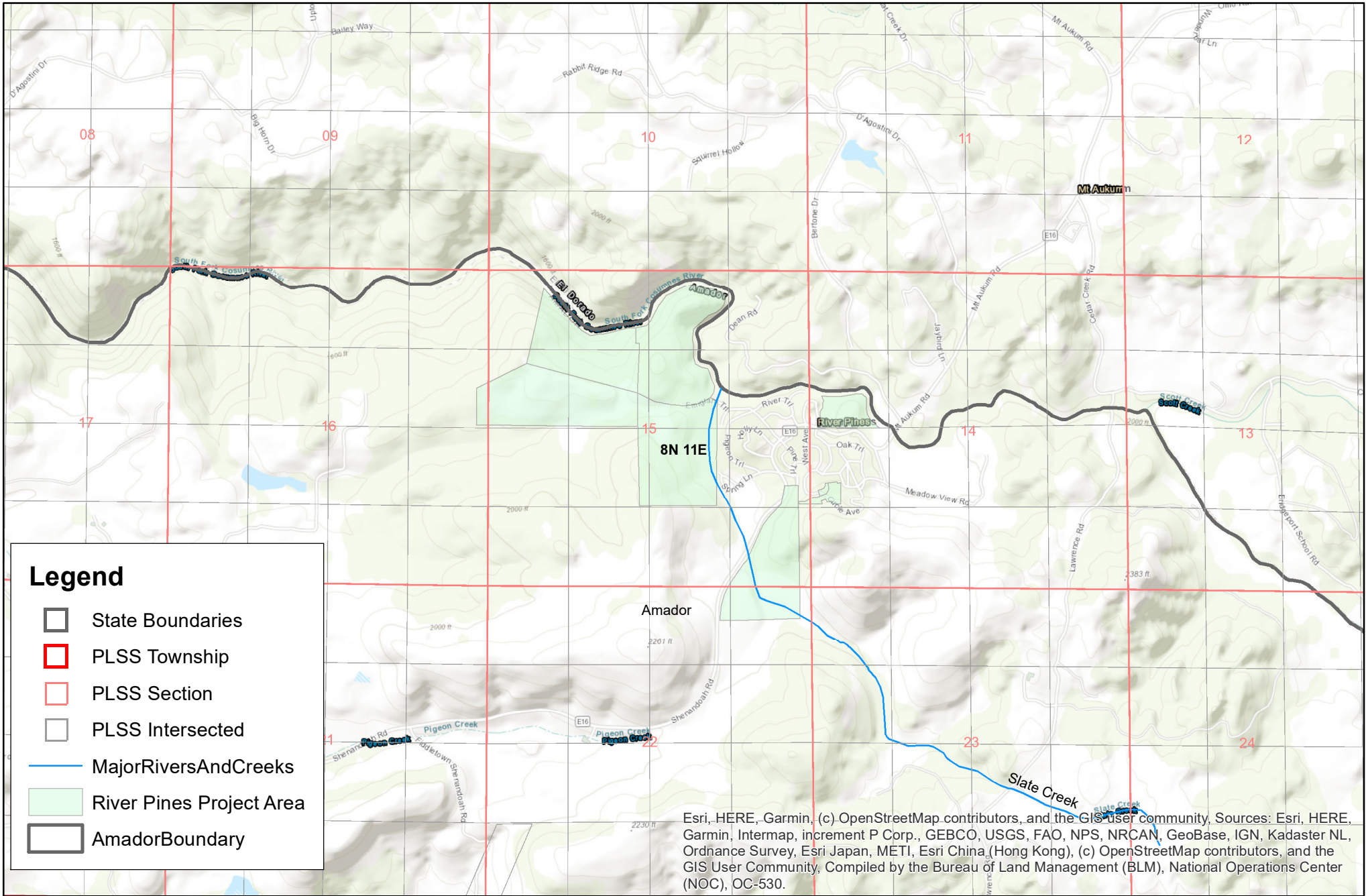

# River Pines Community Fuel Break Planning Map

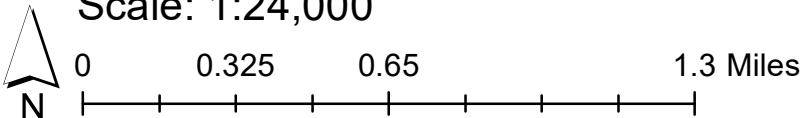
